graduation on his behalf. I remain appreciative of this trust.

I wish to congratulate all the 1292 graduands who will be conferred with various degrees and diplomas today and yesterday morning after having satisfied the committee of examiners and Senate for the awards.

Ladies and Gentlemen

The graduands that the Senate will present to you shortly have been provided with the necessary knowledge in their respective disciplines, as well as skills for discovery. These fine men and women have received adequate mentorship from this institution that will give them an edge over their peers. They

have been equipped well enough to succeed and they shall succeed.

They shall not sit back and complain when they encounter new challenges but will draw from what they have been taught to offer solutions.

As a testimony of the relevance of the University of Malawi, our alumni have continued to be entrusted with various leadership positions in this country and globally. You may have noted for a long time a number of appointments of our alumni into various key government positions. It may take us the whole day to do so and there can never be a clearer endorsement of our training.

Distinguished Guests

On the statistics of this graduation ceremony:

The University continues graduating students not only from here but also from our sister universities; namely, Malawi University of Business and Applied Sciences (MUBAS) and Kamuzu University of Health Sciences (KUHeS). These are our students who were enrolled during the federal University of Malawi at the then Polytechnic, College of Medicine and Kamuzu College of Nursing.

Yesterday and today there are 1292 graduands receiving their certificates of the University of Malawi. Out of these, 1 graduand graduated yesterday with Honoris Causa, 4

are graduating with PhDs, 154 with Masters degrees, 1002 with Bachelors degrees, 8 with Postgraduate diplomas, 107 with Diplomas and 16 with certificates. 508 of the graduands are female and 784 are male (approximately 40% female). I congratulate all our graduands upon reaching this milestone.

Just to give some highlights in the past 6 months since our last graduation ceremonies:

 We have signed a memorandum of understanding with Florida State University for a one-year project on Large Classroom Pedagogy (LCP) project.

- We have embarked on a project titled Unlocking Data: Scaling up uses and users of data in education systems in partnership with Ziz Afrique Foundation with funding from the International Development Research Centre (IDRC).
- We have come up with a Key Innovation to ensure that the digital library responds to the needs of students called Beekee Box, an Offline solar powered Digital Library that enables instructors to upload educational materials onto the box and learners access the materials without any internet connectivity.
- We are implementing a project on Improving Adoption of Nutrition Practices through Community Behaviour Tracking

Mechanism. The project is tracking community level maternal, infant, and young child nutrition (MIYCN) practices and behaviours uptake among households while ensuring compliance in the National Nutrition Information Systems.

Ladies and Gentlemen

Allow me to take a moment to speak directly to the graduands, the Generation Z graduates. You are a unique generation—one that has grown up in a world of rapid technological advancements, global connectivity, and unprecedented challenges. Your generation has witnessed extraordinary

events and has had to adapt to a world that is constantly changing.
