The Department of Languages, Linguistics, and Classical Studies (LLCS) in the School of Humanities and Social Sciences (SHSS) at the University of Malawi invites applications for a full-time position in Classics at the rank of Professor, Associate Professor, Senior Lecturer, Lecturer or Assistant Lecturer. We seek a dynamic scholar with expertise in Greek and Roman literature and religion, committed to excellence in teaching, research, and curriculum innovation.

The successful candidate will join a vibrant team of three full-time faculty, one part-time lecturer, and three tutors, contributing to our undergraduate programmes, including: BA Humanities; BA (Languages and Linguistics); BEd (Languages); BEd (Social Studies). Candidates applying for the position of Assistant Lecturer must be prepared to enrol in and complete a relevant Master's degree within three years of appointment.

**Qualifications and Experience**

- Candidates applying for the Lecturer position must hold a Master's or PhD in classics, along with a Bachelor's degree majoring in classics with a minimum award of credit.
- For the post of Senior Lecturer, Associate Professor, or Professor, candidates must have a strong record of publications in their field of expertise and demonstrate initiative in research, community outreach, and engagement in addition to meeting the required minimum qualifications listed above.
- Teaching expertise in Greek and Roman literature, religion, or related fields, with a proven record of delivering engaging university-level lectures, seminars, and tutorials.
- Proficiency in Latin and/or Ancient Greek, with the ability to teach from beginner to advanced levels.

- Active research profile (publications, conference papers, or grant applications) in Classical Studies.
- Experience in curriculum development and innovative pedagogy (e.g., digital tools, interdisciplinary approaches).

#### **Desirable:**

- Competence in modern languages (e.g., German, French, Italian) for research purposes.
- Knowledge of classical history, archaeology, or reception studies.
- Experience in student supervision, mentorship, or academic leadership.
- Engagement with decolonisation initiatives in Classical Studies.
